A woman from the Musgum tribe, Cameroon. The Musgum, an ethnic group in far north province in Cameroon, created their homes from compressed sun-dried mud. The tall conical dwellings, in the shape of a shell (artillery), featured geometric raised patterns.

A characteristic settlement form is the compound, a cluster of units linked by walls. The domed huts of the musgum people are built in shaped mud, a variant of cob. cob building is the most widely used technique in the world, since no tools are needed – hands, earth and water are enough.

Aqua Tower is an 82-story mixed-use skyscraper in [Chicago](#), Illinois, [USA](#). Designed by Studio Gang Architects, Aqua Tower combines a hotel, offices, rental apartments, condominiums, and parking, along with one of Chicago's largest green roofs. According to architects, the design of the building was inspired by the striated limestone outcroppings common in the Great Lakes area. Joby Aviation's hydrogen-powered air taxi completed a 523-mile test flight, a significant step towards zero-emission regional air travel. The aircraft, which uses a liquid hydrogen fuel cell and hydrogen-electric propulsion system, emitted only water vapor during the flight. The company plans to start commercial operations of its battery-electric air taxi in 2025. The hydrogen-powered model could offer emission-free inter-city aviation in the future. The aircraft's range could be increased to over 900 miles.

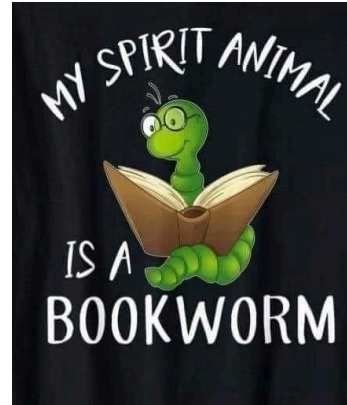

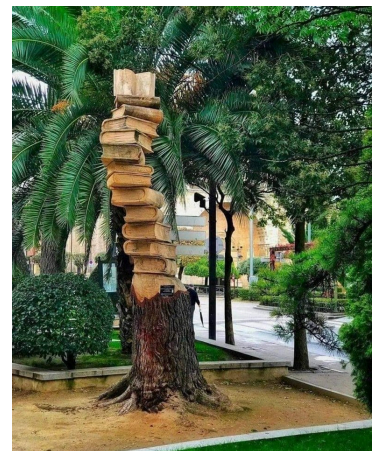
Storytelling Strategies Make Communication About Science More Compelling

Prior to 1920, it was possible to send children through the US Postal service. However, there were certain conditions that needed to be met. Firstly, the children had to weigh less than 50 pounds, and stamps were attached to their clothing as a form of payment. Surprisingly, it was often more cost-effective for individuals to send their children via mail rather than opting for train transportation. Interestingly, during the journey, the children would travel on a train, specifically in the mail car, where they were supervised and provided with nourishment by mail clerks. One remarkable example of this unconventional practice involved a distance of over 700 miles, from Florida to Virginia, covered with a mere 15 cents worth of stamps.

Kaskaskia-Cahokia Trail ·


Cahokia Mounds, located in Illinois, USA, represents the largest pre-Columbian archaeological site north of Mexico and was once a vibrant Native American city. This ancient urban center flourished between the 9th and 15th centuries, peaking around 1100 AD. At its height, Cahokia was home to thousands of people and encompassed over 120 mounds, including Monks Mound, the largest earthen structure north of Mesoamerica. The site is renowned for its sophisticated urban planning, including plazas, residential areas, and ceremonial spaces, reflecting the advanced social, political, and religious practices of its inhabitants, who were part of the Mississippian culture. Cahokia's influence extended across a vast region, with evidence of long-distance trade networks and cultural exchange. Today, Cahokia Mounds is a UNESCO World Heritage site and continues to be a significant archaeological and historical landmark, offering valuable insights into ancient Native American civilizations in North America.

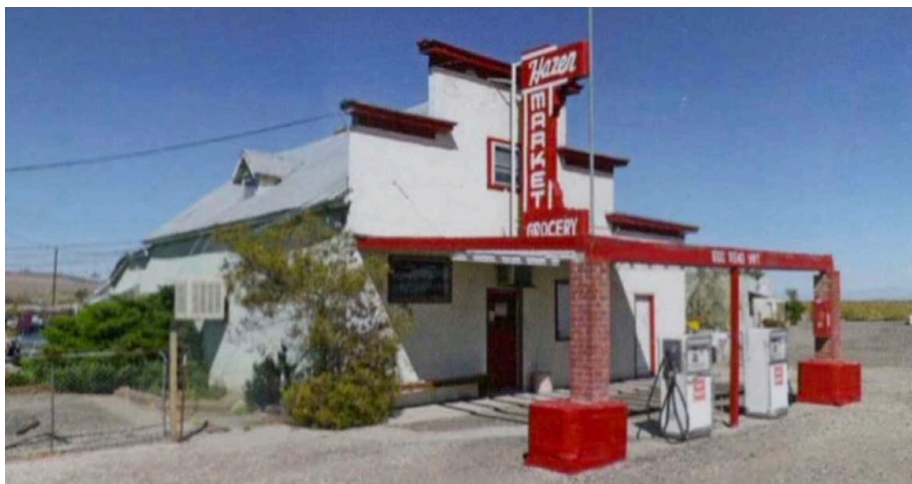
Hopkins to offer free medical school tuition

Hazen, NV. This town was founded in 1903 to house irrigation project workers, and by 1906, the Southern Pacific R. R. had established a station and roundhouse. Hazen is the site of Nevada's last lynching in 1905. The Hazen Market, on the Lincoln Highway and listed on the National Register of Historic Places, was created from structures dating back to 1904, and was rebuilt in 1944. *(a little nostalgia for some of us!)*
