Executive Orders [view all Presidential Documents](#)

The President of the United States manages the operations of the Executive branch of Government through Executive orders. After the President signs an Executive order, the White House sends it to the Office of the Federal Register (OFR).

The OFR numbers each order consecutively as part of a series and publishes it in the daily Federal Register shortly after receipt. For a table of Executive orders that are specific to federal agency rulemaking, see the ACUS [website](#).

This page contains documents that have been published in the Federal Register.* Because the White House cannot deliver a document to the Office of the Federal Register (OFR) until after the President signs a document, there is always a delay (of at least one day, typically of several days) between when the President signs a document and when it is published. Once received, OFR gives presidential documents priority processing and documents will appear on public inspection the business day before publication. If you are looking for a recently-signed Presidential document, you may wish to check the White House [website](#).

Trump officials try to hide record park visitation

After firing 1,000 National Park Service employees and wreaking havoc on the agency's seasonal hiring process, **the Trump administration is now [attempting to hide the fact that national parks saw record visitation in 2024.](#)**

America's national parks saw [over 331 million visits](#) last year, around 1 million more visits than the previous record, set in 2016. But an internal memo went out to Park Service employees on Wednesday telling them not to publicize visitor numbers, according to [reporting by the New York Times](#).

The internal memo said the agency would “not issue a press release or other proactive communications, including social media posts” regarding the numbers. Individual parks could make visitor numbers public if directly asked for them, [it said](#). The data is, however, also [posted online](#).

Meanwhile, parks across the country are struggling to prepare for the upcoming tourist season. In Utah, where the busy season is already underway, [former park superintendents say](#) the Trump administration's dismissals of full time employees and mixed messaging over seasonal hiring will inevitably impact visitors' experiences. **“People should expect long lines, and restrooms aren't going to be clean,”** [warned Sue Fritzke](#), former superintendent of Capitol Reef National Park.

History Bits

- 1493 Mar 15** Christopher Columbus wrote a letter describing Native Americans as “men of great deference and kindness” (which did not prevent him from cutting off their arms if they failed to mine enough gold to meet his quota).
- 1848 Mar 10** The U.S. Senate ratified the Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo, ending war of conquest against Mexico, bringing territory that became Nevada into the Union. The treaty was signed on February 2 and “formally proclaimed” on July 4.
- 1864 Mar 14** Fighting in the Paradise Valley Indian War began with attacks along National Wagon Road; Captain A.B. Wells attacked and destroyed the Paiute camp near Mud (Winnemucca) Lake.
- 1872 Mar 12** President US Grant established the Moapa Indian Reservation by Executive Order; cancelled/re-established in another spot by EO on February 12, 1874. The original reservation included 3,900 sq. miles which the 1875 Congress reduced to 1000 acres which was then increased by Executive Order in 1912 with land allocated to Indians in 1914.
- 1873 Mar 12** President Grant signed an executive order reserving land in Moapa Valley “for the Indians of that locality.”
- 1939 Mar 11** Nevada Senate decided that Indians should have the same right to alcohol as other citizens, gave final approval to measure sponsored by H.E. Springer (Mineral) repealing the ban on liquor sales to Indians; the federal ban on such sales remained.
- 1950 Mar 11** The Confederated Tribes of Nevada began a conference in Nixon to discuss the impending withdrawal of federal guardianship over Native American and other issues.
- 1956 Mar 16** A federal grand jury sitting in Las Vegas recommended to Nevada’s members of Congress that the Las Vegas Indian Village be broken up, the land sold off, and the Native American residents compensated for the loss of their land.
- 1965 Mar 15** Addressing a joint session of Congress, President Johnson called for new legislation to guarantee every American’s right to vote.
- 1989 Mar 14** Edward Abbey, the Thoreau of the desert who worked to redefine the west and especially the desert from a movie stereotype to a besieged region victimized by corporate greed and government exploitation, died in Arizona.
- 2006 Mar 10** The United States was found guilty of violating human rights of Native Americans and urged to “freeze”, “desist” and “stop” actions being taken or threatened to be taken against the Western Shoshone Peoples of the Western Shoshone Nation.
- 2125** Realizing that they had totally compromised existing on Planet Earth, the elite began a scramble to find other planets to exploit for minerals, space and “freedom” during the 21st Century, leaving to the Indigenous.

“For decades, Republican lawmakers and industry lobbyists have tried to chip away at the small program in the Environmental Protection Agency that measures the threat of toxic chemicals. Most people don’t know IRIS, as the program is called, but it is the scientific engine of the agency that protects human health and the environment. Its scientists assess the toxicity of chemicals, estimating the amount of each that triggers cancer and other health effects. And these values serve as the independent, nonpartisan basis for the rules, regulations and permits that limit our exposure to toxic chemicals. Now IRIS faces the gravest threat to its existence since it was created under President Ronald Reagan four decades ago. ... ” [Read more from Pro Publica](#).

3 questions answered about NEPA under Trump

“For the first time in decades, the White House will no longer have National Environmental Policy Act rules. But it will take some time to see changes in how the bedrock environmental law is applied, legal experts say. Project developers are grappling with the potential consequences of President Donald Trump scrapping the White House Council on Environmental Quality’s NEPA regulations — rules that since 1977 have told federal agencies how to analyze the effects of building pipelines, transmission lines, highways and wind farms. The Trump administration’s rescission of CEQ’s rulemaking power — bolstered by recent court decisions against the agency’s regulatory authority — “adds another layer of uncertainty onto the permitting process generally,” said M. Benjamin Cowan, a partner at the law firm Troutman Pepper Locke, which represents clients in the renewable energy sector. ... ” [Read more from E&E News](#).

“President Donald Trump wants to increase logging in national forests and on public lands, including by bypassing endangered species protections. To do that, the federal government would have to activate a seldom-used committee nicknamed the “God Squad” because it can approve federal projects even if it leads to extinction of a species otherwise protected by the Endangered Species Act. But experts say there are strict procedural requirements — and no provision under law to proactively use the committee to bypass protections. War heroes and military firsts are among 26,000 images flagged for removal in Pentagon's DEI purge

References to a World War II Medal of Honor recipient, the Enola Gay aircraft that dropped an atomic bomb on Japan and the first women to pass Marine infantry training are among the tens of thousands of photos and online posts marked for deletion as the Defense Department works to purge diversity, equity and inclusion content, according to a database obtained by The Associated Press. Why this matters:

- Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth had given the military until Wednesday to remove content highlighting diversity efforts in its ranks following President Donald Trump's executive order ending those programs across the federal government. One official, who spoke on condition of anonymity to provide details that have not been made public, said the purge could delete as many as 100,000 images or posts in total.
- The vast majority of the Pentagon purge targets women and minorities, including notable milestones made in the military. But a review of the database also underscores the confusion among agencies about what to remove following Trump's order.
- In some cases, photos seemed to be flagged for removal simply because their file included the word "gay," including service members with that last name and an image of the B-29 aircraft Enola Gay.
